Harbormaster Position Update

Commissioner Singer said interviews were held last Friday. There were quite a few candidates, and the selection came down to the Commissioners. There were several steps and processes to go through, including verifying several things, selections, legal steps, etc.

Motion: Move to approve Daryll Trask as Harbormaster

Moved by: Commissioner Lawrence Seconded by: Commissioner Green

Motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Comments

Commissioner Lawrence welcomed everybody and said it was a long process to choose a harbormaster. He read all the comment cards and asked that everybody please give Daryll as much respect as possible. The weather has been nice, so be on the look out for paddleboarders. A lot of little things are coming up. Guest moorage is shutting down soon. Progress made is going back into the Port.

Commissioner Green thanked Port Commissioner Tripp for filling in for both Accounting and Harbormaster. She appreciates her effort to keep the Port running smoothly. She passed along her congratulations to Daryll and is looking forward to seeing him and what he brings to the Port. She thinks he will do wonderful things.

Commissioner Singer said Daryll will start on the 26th. Watch out for one another. Winter moorage will not be available this year. The restrooms will still be open, but the office for rentals for incoming guests is moving out to the breakwater.

Public Comments

Doug Taper is now a City Council member for the last five months. In July he volunteered to be the new liaison for the Port. He hears the bulkhead is the biggest issue. He is untangling things between the Port and the City and figuring out how to move forward. Doug then read aloud two points in an email he plans to send.

Bill Arch, B-32, can buy a boat in C-53, which is a 53' boat. He's confused about the process of transferring liveaboard status over there. He realizes there are electrical issues and the waitlist for a bigger boat is maybe two years. He doesn't have a good connection to figure out what's going on.

Mike Regus, former City Councilmember of eight years, read the minutes of July 18th, and realizes why the Port is upset about things not moving forward with the bulkhead project. He was a processor of applications of shoreline management. He knows the process and that Port Accountant Tripp is trying to get this thing pulled closer together. He'd like to get the Port and City to wake up and meet. He knows the Port has a schedule and timelines. He wants to be an assistant on his side of things with the City and get council members to understand the issue. He has suggestions if the City isn't responsive.

Craig Muller, C-11, met the new coordinator for permanent moorage and said she is very personable.

Loren Heights, end of A Dock, said John has a small, green, wooden sailboat in beautiful condition. There's a derelict boat next to him and is wondering if it's possible to move it somewhere else. There's a spot on the end of D Dock without any boats because of shallow water. The water can't be too shallow for a derelict boat. He appreciates it if it can be moved to another slip.

Old Business Items Reservation Policy

At the last meeting, Port Accountant Tripp sent out the standard operating procedures. She knew where the binder was kept and used it as a training manual. That binder is now nowhere to be found, and she isn't sure where it went. It disappeared about a year ago. She thinks it would be appropriate to redraft it. It isn't a policy, just a description of how things are done at the Port. There are specific steps to enter, and multiple check lists she can locate. There's enough of a skeleton bring it back. She confirmed funds are being lost because of the current reservation policy. People don't show up, slips don't get filled, and things turn into a jumble.

Commissioner Singer said the policy needs to be very clear and to examine the Port's vision so the right action is taken for boaters and the Port. Slips need to be filled. The Port want boaters to get a slip, and want the Port to be able to rent the slips. That's the goal. It needs to be made clear and understandable and allows someone to call ahead to get a reservation knowing they can get one. It's on the Port to determine how to operate and handle the slips if there's a cancellation.

New Business Items

Commissioner Responses to Public Comments/Discussions

Commissioner Singer mentioned Loren's comment. Port Accountant Tripp said there have been several complaints made about the derelict vessel; everybody would love to pick their neighbors. There are two derelict boats left by the City with no follow up. Previous management chose to ignore the situation, and it became hers to handle. She didn't do anything with the situation because there was no money for reimbursement until after July 1st. Now money can be requested. There are three bids to dispose of the boats. The Port has the bids now, but have to wait, per the RCWs, 90 days to pickup either of the boats. There's one problematic person who is known throughout Kitsap and Pierce Counties who acquires and abandons boats. The vessels can't be moved and it's unfortunately where things are at the moment. Patience is what's needed for now.

Commissioner Green welcomed Doug. She said he'll have big shoes to fill, and Dave will gladly share his words of wisdom.

Commissioner Singer thanked Mike for his input and knows he provided Port Accountant Tripp with some data. The electrical system on C Dock is in bad shape. Engineers have looked at it and it can't be drawing anymore current on the dock at this time. There aren't enough funds to address the issue, and it isn't currently a priority. The Port cannot accommodate a 53' boat on C Dock for now. Regarding the appeal made at the last meeting, Port Accountant Tripp will find the appeal policy documentation and send it to Stuart. Commissioner Singer said if you want to run the Port, run for Port Commissioner. If you want to assist the Port, provide input.
