# Old Business Items

## **Comprehensive Plan**

Mr. Piccone said the aluminum ramp's fabrication is now complete and he is waiting on installation in the next couple of weeks. He received word the navigation lights have shipped earlier in the week and the contractor will install them once they're received. BMI indicated they'll be done fabricating the 50' finger piers by August 28<sup>th</sup>. There still is no firm date on the 30' finger piers.

The E & F Dock design and specifications are 80% complete. He and Port Accountant Trip have been talking about some long lead procurement items (the electrical components) and it's not uncommon for those to take up to nine months from the time ordered to arrival. He explained the risks for extended electrical outages and wanted to shorten those as much as possible.

Port Accountant Tripp shared a spreadsheet that described capital improvement projects and their anticipated budget (dredging: \$1.1 million; X Dock relocation and electrical upgrades: \$1.1 million; B Dock float and pile refurbishment: \$1.1 million, among others). She will figure out an estimated timeline for grants along with the budget for the programs. The capital improvement list will need to be discussed eventually to figure out what the priorities are and what the board wants to do. The Commissioners agreed the spreadsheet was good as discussed regarding the order of the projects for Port Accountant Tripp to look closer at.

Mr. Piccone suggested, along with the priority dredging permit, the budget have a line item to determine what budget is sufficient for dredging. The dredging areas should be prioritized according to what's most needed to least needed. Dredging can be scaled to fit the budget number the Port is working with.

#### **New Business Items**

# **Commissioner Responses to Public Comments/Discussions**

Commissioner Green said she is very open and receptive to the idea of a bi-annual joint PBA/Commissioner meeting to continue dialogue and moving forward together. She wanted to touch on Port Accountant Tripp's point about the workshop meetings (the second meeting of the month) continuing as a trial phase. She thinks it's worth putting together a pro/con list to see if it's going to interfere with approving items such as minutes, etc. If the workshop meetings are interfering with Port business, then maybe it's worth going back to the previous format.

Commissioner Singer wanted to talk about Stuart's mentioning people fearing retaliation. He wants the sense down at the Port to be one of no retaliation. All the Commissioners want is for the Port to run well and to run it in accordance with its regulations. He has heard several comments in the parking lot about how things are handled and done at the Port regarding the tenant who was recently removed from the Port. Those people making comments don't know the full circumstance, and because of privacy laws, the board will not be discussing the full circumstances. He can assure everyone there was no retaliation against that individual or any other individual at the Port.

Commissioner Singer said the handbook of the Port Regulations has all the rules the Port follows. If every one of the lessees followed the handbook, then no one could question the lease conditions, their moorage spot, fees, when they're due, or what can occur if fees aren't

paid. Lessees who do not adhere to the regulations will have their lease terminated. He's realizing now that for quite a few past years, Port management did not want to 100% enforce the rules. Slack was given to some. Things were overlooked. Now it's going down hill and people think they can get away with things and then feel picked on because they're being held accountable to adhere to the regulations. The Poulsbo Marina regulations are the rules and regulations the Port will run by. It will be run fairly and treat each of the tenants the same. If there are questions about what lessees should be doing, please get a copy of the handbook and see what regulations apply. Every lessee signed the handbook and agreed to it. All the Port wants is for people to pay for their moorage so the Port can pay for things to better improve the Port. There is no retaliation.

Regarding unsigned letters, Commissioner Singer understands the intent of the PBA. He was one of the first people in the PBA when it was first formed. How can the board ever address a person if they don't address their letters describing their concerns? Come forward and talk to the board about it. Do it in a courteous manner. Let's agree to follow the handbook, communicate openly, and be a cohesive group that makes the Port successful.

### **Kitsap Rowing Association**

Maryellen, the Vice President of the Kitsap Rowing Association, wanted to talk about who the association is, what they're about, and the challenges they face. The cost to row with the KRA is \$600. To row at a neighboring club is more than twice that. It is the KRA's philosophy to include anyone who wants to row. They don't want their club to be for the elite and don't want to raise the fees. They follow state regulations and state laws. They don't pay their coaches; their association is entirely volunteer run. The association has a due and fee assistance policy. They also have a scholarship fund. They offer safety classes and are partnering with the North Kitsap Fire Department.

Maryellen explained the association will have to find a place for their organization and they don't know where they're going to end up with the Port. They don't want to be stereotyped as a bunch of rich individuals who want to row. They are a group of simple people who want to row. Increasing fees and dues go against what they were founded for. They know their dock fees are going to go up and they don't know where they're going to go. They're at a tipping point and given the fact that they have opportunities to provide more rowing opportunities to people, they can't think outside of the box they're in right now. She asked the Port to embrace who the Kitsap Rowing Association is and to consider waiving dock fees or requiring a nominal fee. They have youth programs available and don't want to charge for those. She said the club will end up disappearing.

Manager's Report

# **Public Comments & Requests for Future Agenda Items**

Councilman Musgrove recommended a public comments section during the workshop meetings. He said the Port operates under slightly different rules than the City. Regarding the Kitsap Rowing Association, there's sometimes an opportunity for public benefit that things can be squeezed in and made clear there's not something for nothing. He encouraged the Port to search for things that could benefit the Port and be done on the Port's behalf.

There was a public comment stating when there is a public invitation to a meeting, the public needs to be provided with an opportunity to make comments (referring to the workshop meetings). He expressed concerns about the fire suppression system that was installed. One part is falling in the water already. He noticed fittings and bulbs are already starting to rust. If it fails in the next couple of years, he can guarantee the insurance companies will hold the Port liable.

Another public comment included questions about funding within the Port district. She wondered how annexation works and how big the Port district is. She also asked if the Port has any agreements with Parks and Rec.

#### **Commissioner Comments**

Commissioner Green said this meeting was informative and she enjoyed the information shared. She encouraged everyone to enjoy what's left of summer.

Commissioner Singer has never seen any previous commissioners just walk the docks and talk to people. He's been walking the docks half a dozen times just in the last week. He brings his family and talks to people on their boats. He needs tenants to understand the requirements. Management needs to understand the requirements and uphold them.

# Port Commissioner Meeting

## Maintenance: Eugene

- Maintenance has been working on safety devices in marina, cleaning and rebuilding life ring stands as needed. Also going through fire extinguisher checks and replacing cabinets.
- I discussed with the executive directors of ports Kingston and Bremerton if we could come and look at their facilities and look to see how maintenance can be improved on our end as well as there's. I will be setting this meeting up hopefully within the next few weeks.

## Guest Moorage: Jannese

- The past few weeks we have completed all the many details for the paddling & comedy event.
- Last week I attended a meeting via zoom with the organizers of the 2024 Chris Craft Rendezvous. Their annual event has taken place in Port Orchard over the 2nd weekend in July for many years. I have tried to convenience them for several years to move this event to the Port of Poulsbo, with very little luck. (We were able to get a fall casual cruise organized with about 15 boats in attendance). We recently got very lucky, and they are considering moving to Poulsbo! There are still a few details to work on before a decision is made.
- Our 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter Newsletter was completed and published on August 1<sup>st</sup>. I posted on the HDPA's
  FB page asking the members if they had information that they would like included in our
  Newsletter. Two of the members were eager and appreciative to be included.

### Permanent Moorage: Kaitlyn

- Occupancy is 95% Due to customers selling their boats. The wait list for boats over 35' are looking at a year or more before a slip is available, we have 50 people on our wait list most of them are in the 35'-45' range.
- The gates on AA, A, B and C dock are operational. We have started the key exchange and Kaitlyn will be in the office on Saturday August 5<sup>th</sup> from 9am to 1:30pm to allow anyone who cannot come during the work week to stop by and trade the old keys out. Once again when the majority of the keys have been exchanged the code will be removed and you will only be able to access the dock with your gate key.

- I went to the All ports meeting on Monday, was very informative as we had open discussion with WPPA (Washington Public Ports Association) on appropriations at the federal level of funding repairs in our ports. It was very constructive and suggested in our talks as to possibly, all ports in our region joining together to help lobby with WPPA for that funding. - In the All ports meeting I was able to discuss social media cross marketing with the other ports. Bremerton as well as Kingston and Poulsbo will join together to market events on each other's platforms to increase awareness of events.
